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2019-20 TCS EOG/EOC Summer Program Plan

General Plan:

Per guidance from NCDPI this year, EOG/EOC remediation and readministration, as a component of a summer program, is an option for students who passed a course/subject but have scored Not Proficient on the associated EOC or EOG assessment, excluding Grades 3-8 Reading EOG, English II EOC, and NCEXTEND1 Science and Biology as a result of Read to Achieve General Statute for Grade 3 ELA and the standard setting process with the new reading and EXTEND1 assessments. Districts may administer the EOG or EOC tests during a summer program that occurs after the academic year. These test scores will not be included in growth analysis for school accountability or for educator effectiveness. However, the higher score will be included in proficiency calculations for school accountability within the current accountability year. The 2019–20 accountability year ends on July 6, 2020. Summer school EOG and EOC test scores uploaded to the NCDPI by July 6, 2020 will be included in 2019–20 accountability analysis.

NCDPI is not specifying the number of days the summer program must be conducted or whether transportation is required. Instruction may occur on teacher workdays but the readministration of EOG and EOC assessments must occur after the conclusion of the student academic school year. Student participation is voluntary. Parents or guardians must make the final decision regarding a student's summer school attendance; students should be held harmless if they do not participate. Additionally, for the 2019–20 school year, schools offering a summer program must have it approved by their local board. Schools must notify parents about the summer program including, but not limited to, the dates it will occur, its purpose, and who is eligible to attend. All EOC and EOG assessments must be administered during the NCDPI-designated testing windows.

Thomasville City Schools EOG/EOC Summer Remediation and Test Re-administration Plan:

Dates:

- ➤ Elementary and Middle School May 28- June 3: Remediation and skill boost, June 4-5: Re-administration (8 AM 1 PM each day)
- ➤ **High School** June 3-5: Remediation and skill boost, June 8-9: Re-administration (8 AM 1 PM each day)
- **Purpose:** To provide opportunities for students to increase their skills in the areas of, grades 4 8 Math, NC Math I and NC Math III, 5th/8th grade science, and High School Biology and demonstrate mastery of grade level content.
- **Eligibility:** Students who scored Not Proficient on an EOG or EOC and students assessed through NC Extend 1. Transportation will be provided for those students who normally ride a school bus. Students who do not attend any of the summer program remediation will not be permitted to participate in the readministration opportunity.
- Security of test materials/test format: All re-administration of the EOG/EOC will be taken online and all test security measures will be ensured similar to those of the regular administration of the EOG/EOC.

School Plans:

Each school will devise their process for providing remediation to eligible students based on data. Once test scores are received, schools should begin the process of remediation, notify parents of the summer program opportunity by providing them with the intent letter, and report to transportation the names of students who intend to participate and will require a bus. Schools will decide which teachers from their school will work the summer program.

Breakfast/Lunch:

Schools will serve breakfast and lunch as normal these days.
