

Thomasville City Schools Plan for In-Person Learning for 2021-22

Thomasville City Schools have fully returned to in-person learning in all grades for the 2021-22 school year. All instruction is occurring in-person five days per week, except for those circumstances where remote instruction is a component of the course offering (e.g NCVPS courses or CCP courses).

TCS continues to follow the latest health and safety guidance as provided by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction and the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services through the StrongSchoolsNC Toolkit, as well as any executive orders from the Governor in place at the time.

TCS will also continue health and safety protocols regarding cleaning and disinfecting practices, as well as other important risk-mitigation strategies. Distancing will be maintained to the extent practical and any mask requirements will follow the guidance from NCDHHS and the Governor's Office. In addition, the TCS Board of Education conducts a vote on continuing mask requirements at each monthly Board meeting as required by North Carolina General Statute.

Transportation has resumed regular operation regarding routes, times, and capacity. Masks are required on TCS school buses as required by Federal guidelines, regardless of any local mask requirements.

TCS adheres to CDC, NCDHHS, and Davidson County Health Department guidelines regarding contact tracing, quarantine, and isolation for students and staff who contract Covid or are presumptive positive. TCS employs a nurse in each school to help ensure the safety and wellness of our students and staff.

Hundreds of TCS students and employees have been vaccinated, and students 5 and over who are eligible to be vaccinated are encouraged to do so.
